- - It should come as no surprise that London is world famous as a city of culture. From brilliant museums to theaters and concerts, London has it all. If you love art, there are many wonderful galleries with art from around the globe. In fact, the only problem with London's art galleries is that there are so many. It is very difficult to find time to visit them all!
 - Although there are many types of art you could choose to see in London, as you are in Britain, why not start with some British art? Tate Britain has the largest collection of British art in the world and is the place to see the famous British landscapes by J.W.M. Turner, and the strangely compelling portraits by Francis Bacon. Tate Modern, on the other hand, displays some of the biggest names in contemporary British art such as Damien Hirst. Two other galleries well worth visiting are the National Gallery where you can see paintings by Van Gogh, Constable and Leonardo da Vinci, and the National Portrait Gallery which boasts portraits of famous people from Shakespeare to royalty. Best of all, all the galleries mentioned here are free to enter!
 - However, not all famous art collections are to be found in public galleries. One of the biggest collections belongs to Queen Elizabeth II. The Royal Collection consists of nearly 200,000 pieces, including more than 7,000 paintings and 40,000 watercolors and drawings. Some of this amazing collection can be viewed by the public at Windsor Castle and Buckingham Palace, while other parts are only displayed in the Queen's private residences. Some of the most famous works included are six paintings by Rembrandt, a Monet, and the largest collection of drawings by Leonardo da Vinci anywhere in the world. British artists are represented by Gainsborough and Hogarth to name but two.
 - Japanese art is also well represented all around the UK. Japanese exhibits are on display in more than 150 museums around the British Isles, including the British Museum and the National Museum in Cardiff. Perhaps the most famous Japanese artist to have had her work displayed in London is Yoko Ono. It was at her exhibition at the Indica Gallery in 1966 that she first met her future husband, John Lennon!

If you enjoy art, by all means put aside at least a few days to browse the wonderful galleries London has to offer. Whatever your taste, London is without a doubt an art lover's paradise!
