- - In the past, nearly everything was made by hand. Craftspeople made cups, chairs, and other items that were both useful and beautiful. Over time, machines and factories became the main producers of goods. That has led to the disappearance of some handicrafts. Fortunately, many arts have been kept alive through public interest and passionate supporters.
 - One lost art is the illuminated manuscript*. Like all books in Europe up until 1450, illuminated manuscripts were made by hand. The words were first copied onto a page. Artisans* then added beautiful borders and illustrations. The first letter of the chapter was often made especially large and colorful. Paints made from natural materials provided the color, and thin strips of gold (called gold leaf) helped to bring the design to life. However, creating these treasures was expensive and time-consuming. After the printing press was invented, fewer and fewer were made.
 - A more recent art form lost to technology is the hand-painted theater poster. In the mid to late 20th century, going to the movies in Japan, Taiwan, and elsewhere had a special touch. Outside theaters, moviegoers could see large paintings advertising the newest films. To make a billboard painting, an artist started with a small movie poster. From that, he or she painted a much larger

- version. The billboards emphasized the main actors and actresses, whose names were painted in large letters. After just a few decades, though, this art form was replaced by large posters made with modern printing methods.
- But all is not lost. People in many countries are still interested in handicrafts. They pick up skills by attending classes and reading books, magazines, and websites. This has helped to preserve arts such as pottery and jewelry making. At arts and crafts shows, craftspeople sell their goods and chat with shoppers, just as they did 1,000 years ago. Governments are also helping. For example, the Crafts Council of India helps craftspeople find new selling opportunities. Many of them meet up once a year at the Kamala Show to share ideas and sell their goods.
- Modern technology has influenced our lives in many positive ways. Yet people still appreciate the personal touch of a handmade craft. Making and buying traditional crafts are excellent ways to celebrate one's culture and keep it alive. It's a shame that not all lost arts can be brought back. But even when they die out, museums give us a chance to appreciate the care and effort that went into them.
