- - In 2014, the Central Japan Railway Company began constructing a new railway for the high-speed Maglev Chuo Shinkansen*, which will eventually run from Tokyo to Osaka. Passengers will not have much chance to enjoy the scenery, as 86 percent of the route is inside tunnels. The goal of the nine trillion-yen project is simple: to get people to their destinations as quickly as possible.
 - Technological advances have enabled us to save time not only in transportation but also in many other ways: communication, research, production, household chores, and so on. This could have led to a steady increase in leisure. In fact, it has not: we seem to have become busier than ever.
 - In order to squeeze as much as possible into the limited time between waking up and going to bed, we have developed the habit of multi-tasking, for example, eating and listening to music while doing homework (a habit that ends up greatly reducing the value of each activity).
 - The trend toward doing things faster and being busier has led to a backlash* in the form of the Slow Movement. This is said to have begun as a response to the opening of a McDonald's fast-food store next to the Spanish Steps in Rome in 1986. Some Italians saw this as a threat to their relaxed culture, and responded

by creating a movement called Slow Food, which uses ingredients that are fresh, seasonal, and grown without the use of chemicals. Slow Food is cooked slowly and carefully, using traditional recipes, and enjoyed with friends and relatives, paying no attention to time.

- There is also a Slow Cities Association that began in Italy and has attracted new members from many other countries including Japan. Potential members must have fewer than 50,000 residents, and commit to certain principles, including banning traffic from the town center, restricting noise and neon signs, supporting traditional architecture, and promoting local food and craft products.
- Google's finance manager quit his well-paid job in 2015 in order to travel around the world as a backpacker. Most of us can't afford to do that. But we can still be Slow Travelers when we go on vacation. That means spending more time in fewer places and getting to know the local people and their way of life. The slow traveler visits slow cities, wanders around without a map or an itinerary, and sits in local parks watching people and making new friends.
- If you are feeling stressed out and exhausted, there's a very simple solution: slow down, relax and enjoy your life!
