  - As we search for new forms of energy to meet the challenges of global warming, biofuels have emerged as a strong candidate. Unlike fossil fuels such as oil, coal and gas, the supply of biofuel is inexhaustible. It will never run out because it is made from readily available organic materials such as plants and waste matter. Bioethanol\*, for example, is made from corn or sugar cane. What is more, it is much more environmentally friendly than fossil fuels since it emits no harmful substances like sulfur dioxide\*.
  - Yet, as with fossil fuels, burning biofuels results in the release of carbon dioxide. The release of this carbon dioxide, however, does not pose a serious problem. As they grow, plants used to make biofuels absorb carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, and this is released back into the air when they are burnt. There is no net gain or loss of CO<sub>2</sub>, and so the process is described as being carbonneutral.
  - On the other hand, many scientists and researchers have pointed out that biofuels are not a perfect solution to our problems. It is true that, compared to fossil fuels, they do not add  $CO_2$  to the atmosphere, but describing them as carbon neutral is not completely accurate. The factories that produce biofuels are mostly

powered by fossil fuels. So are the trucks, planes and ships that transport biofuels to their destinations. These activities naturally result in the release of  $CO_2$ .

- Biofuel production also brings economic problems. Since corn is a primary component of bioethanol, demand for it has gone up dramatically compared with the pre-biofuel era. Consequently, the price has sharply increased, making it difficult for developing countries to import it at a reasonable price. Also, farmers in the U.S. have discovered that growing corn for bioethanol is more profitable than growing other crops. They are therefore using more and more of their farmland for this purpose, which reduces the amount of food crops the U.S. produces.
- As we can see, while being superior in some ways to fossil fuels, biofuels are not a magic solution to the problem of global warming.
