- - Americans can ski in the mountains, sunbathe on the beach, or ride horses across wide open plains without ever leaving their country. But diverse geography also creates various natural disasters. There are earthquakes and massive forest fires on the West Coast, tornadoes screaming across the Great Plains, hurricanes hitting the Gulf Coast, and blizzards striking the Northeast.
 - There are also volcanoes. On May 18, 1980, the most destructive volcanic eruption* in American history occurred at Mt. St. Helens. At the time, scientists were monitoring seismic activity* there because minor eruptions a couple months earlier had attracted their attention. They caught the sudden, enormous eruption on film, giving Americans a dramatic and detailed look at the disaster as it spread.
 - Before the eruption, Mt. St. Helens had an elevation of 9,677 feet. In addition to volcanic ash that darkened the sky hundreds of miles away, an earthquake caused a massive landslide*. After the disaster, the mountain's elevation had fallen to 8,363 feet. The landslide and terrible heat melted and even boiled centuries-old ice. The resulting flood caught local residents unawares. Fortunately, because the area was thinly populated, only 57 people died, but so

did thousands of animals and trees. In the decades since, there have been occasional seismic activity and some small eruptions.

- Today, the area is designated Mt. St. Helens National Volcanic Monument. Geologists study the active volcano's mechanisms and biologists research how ecosystems respond to disasters. There is plenty of life around the volcano now. The volcanic ash provided benefits to things that live in the water that helped their populations grow rapidly, while new plants and animals have recolonized the blast* zone on land.
- There are also many people. The monument is open to tourists, who can view the horseshoe-shaped crater from an observatory* less than five miles away. Hikers walk on the slopes year-round. However, a word of caution: Scientists

 predict that future eruptions will be more destructive because the current lava dome* will require greater pressure to burst than it did in 1980.
