- - Around the world, scientists are working together to put humans on Mars. It won't be easy. Going to Mars isn't a short trip. At its closest, Mars is 150 times farther away from us than our moon is. Using the fuel in today's rockets, it would take about six months to get there. That's a long trip.
 - There are many dangers in space. One danger is radiation*. It is a form of energy that can harm people. It can cause cancer and even kill. Luckily, spaceships do block some radiation. Spacesuits block more of it, but not all. Something stronger needs to be invented. Engineers are working on this problem now.
 - There are other problems astronauts face, too. Long trips in space can weaken bones. On Earth, bones stay healthy when muscles pull on them. The muscles fight against gravity. There is no gravity in space, so bones grow weak. Astronauts are already testing a new exercise machine. It makes the astronauts feel like they are pushing against gravity. Scientists are also studying a new medicine. It will keep bones from becoming weak.
 - 4 It is important that the crew members get along, too. They will be cooped up* together for a long time. They might become restless. They may argue. Yet all

of the astronauts need to get along. If something goes wrong, they will have to find a solution. It would take too long to get help from Earth. The crew needs to handle emergencies together.

- After the rockets and the crew are ready to go, it is time for the next step. Some scientists think the next step is to go to Mars. They think crews should make a short visit to Mars, then go back to Earth. Others think a Mars trip should be one-way. They believe a Mars colony could be set up within 10 years.
- To live on Mars, people will need water, air, and food. Luckily, Mars has some resources. It has ice. The ice could be taken from the ground for drinking and washing. Oxygen in the water could make air to breathe.
- Learning more about Mars and space travel is very important. It will help astronauts and engineers make decisions. By working together, humans may one day reach Mars. Then the people of Earth can call the Red Planet home, too.
